## COURSE/CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

A laboratory where students work on material that accompanies the remedial mathematics course in which they are enrolled. Involves individualized instruction and use of media and computers. This course is offered on a Credit/No Credit basis. The 36 required hours must be undertaken in the Math Lab. Maximum credit 4 units.

## STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by completing at least 36 hours in the math lab before finals.

**REQUIREMENTS:** Total of 36 hours (minimum) logged in on the math lab's "Check-in" computer. If you do not log in and out, there will be no record of attendance.

**GRADING:** Pass/No Pass; credit will be given if a minimum of 36 hours has been spent in the Math Lab by Wednesday, May 8, 2013.

**ATTENDANCE:** You can come to the lab *during any hours that the lab is open*. Check the Math Lab webpage for hours. (Currently: M-R 8:00am- 9:00pm, F 8:00am- 5:00pm, S 8:00am -1:00pm) There may be a few exceptions associated with special events in which it will not be fully available. *Always* log in and log out of the math lab computer at the entrance. This is how we keep a record of your accumulated hours.
