Student Learning Outcomes

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by being able to:

- 1. Produce common contractions in speaking (ex. did not = didn't, am = 'm, etc.) (ISLO1)
- 2. Differentiate between similar-sounding words by making a distinction between sounds. (ISLO1)
- 3. Produce appropriate rising of falling intonation in Yes/No questions and Wh- Questions. (ISLO1)
- 4. Apply the pronuciation rules of 3rd person (-s) ending and plural noun (-s) endings in aural discrimination activities. (ISLO1)
- 5. Apply the pronunciation rules for (-ed) endings in past forms of regular verbs in aural discrimination activities. (ISLO1)

Class Rules

Attendance: You are allowed to miss three classes excused or unexcused during the semester. If you miss more than three classes, you will be dropped from the class.
