Objectives:

- 1. To acquire knowledge of healthy singing techniques
- 2. To acquire knowledge of the vocal mechanism and its proper function in producing a beautiful singing tone
- 3. To sing a variety of vocal repertoire of increasing difficulty in different languages
- 4. To develop a love for vocal performance through solo and ensemble singing
- 5. To acquire a fine degree of mastery of solo and ensemble vocal performance

Class Structure/Routine: Classes will entail, Vocal Warm-Ups; and lectures/videos, etc. on vocal techniques, the vocal mechanism, vocal performance, and the art of singing. Students will be taught and assigned various vocal solo selections suitable for their voice type, range, level of proficiency; and will be given guidance on proper vocal execution of the repertoire. It is expected that students will do at least 2 hours of individual practice per week, on assigned songs. Students will be required to perform the assigned songs weekly, and will be graded on their progress. In addition to solo work, students will learn Vocal Class Ensemble Selections to be performed in Concerts, on and off-campus. Please note that this is a Vocal Performance Class, hence, participation in Concerts are important and mandatory.

Lecture Segment of Class: (Mainly for 1st Semester Class)

Weeks 1-3......Chapters 1-3 (Healthy Singing, Singing Preparation, Music Selection)
Weeks 4-6.....Chapters 4-6 (Learning Music, Practice Habits, Performing)
Weeks 7-9.....Chapters 7-9 (Muscles, Alignment, Breathing, Making Sound)
Weeks 10-12....Chapters 10-12 (Voice Quality, Resonance, Articulation, Expression)

Grading: 1st Semester Students **might** be given a written quiz on the Lecture Materials. ALL students will do 2 voice solo performance exams; and Perform in Solo and Class Ensemble Concerts on and off Campus. These will be graded.

Written Quiz – 10% Voice Solo and Ensemble Exams/Concerts- 60/70% Class Preparedness- 30% TOTAL – 100%
