Course Objectives

By the end of this course a successful student will be able to:

- Fabricate custom, preformed and aluminum temporary crowns
- Fabricate a custom 3-unit acrylic temporary bridge 2.
- Temporarily cement a crown and bridge on a model 3.
- Condense, carve and finish a Class II temporary restoration 4.
- Apply a rubber dam and remove a rubber dam at an expectable level 5.
- Demonstrate proficiency in the use of calcium hydroxide base used in pre-pared tooth
- Demonstrate proficiency in placing and removing a matrix and wedge on a mannequin 6. 7.
- Demonstrate proficiency in placing insulating bases in a prepared tooth 8.
