COURSE DESCRIPTION

CIS 050 presents the basics of taking a course through the Internet. It is designed to acquaint students with the skills required for success in an online course. Students will learn to navigate in an online environment, to communicate electronically with the instructor and other students, to submit course assignments and take tests, and to perform other related skills. Hardware and software needs are addressed as well as characteristics of successful online learners. Students must have access to a computer that is connected to the Internet and must have an e-mail account. Recommended Preparation: Knowledge of word processing, browser, and e-mail software.

COURSE GOALS

The purpose of this course is for you to acquire the ability to use the tools of technology and to develop the strategies necessary to be successful taking a course online.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Understand what online classes are and how a course management system works.
- Identify what types of assignments will be required in the online setting and what hardware and software is needed.
- Use the IVC course management system to participate in a class
- Communicate asynchronously and understand the concept of synchronous communication
- Review standards for academic writing and understand and use Netiquette in online communication.
- Use E-mail and send an E-mail attachment
- Recognize what personal characteristics are needed for success in an online course.
- Locate, evaluate, and effectively use information.

GRADING POLICIES

This course may be taken on a credit/no-credit basis. To earn a credit (CR) grade, you must obtain 70 or more points by the end of the course.
