In this course you will have the opportunity to develop critical writing and reading skills, as well as the rhetorical tools necessary to create a college level essay. Lectures, discussion, and assignments will provide instruction and practice in the following:

- constructing complete sentences with few errors in sentence structure such as fragments, comma splices, run-on sentences
- multi-paragraph essay organization
- production of writing in which meaning is unobscured by grammar or usage errors in punctuation, spelling, subject-verb agreement, verb tense, word choice, and word order
- creating and supporting a thesis statement or controlling idea
- pre-writing strategies, including brainstorming and outlining
- ability to compose a multi-paragraph essay in response to a reading
- applying rhetorical modes found in argumentative essays with emphasis on narration, description, and exemplification
