Course Description: ESL 002 is a grammar class in an English -only environment designed for the low-intermediate ESL student. The course will cover grammar and simple sentences writing.

Prerequisites: A grade of "C" or higher in ESL 001, or appropriate placement.

Course Objectives: Students will

- 1. Demonstrate competency in classifying the following parts of speech: nouns, verbs, pronouns, adjectives, adverbs of frequency, and prepositions.
- 2. Demonstrate competency in creating affirmative and negative statements, yes/no questions, and wh- questions with the verb "**be**" and other verbs in simple present.
- 3. Demonstrate mastery in using the modal "**can**" for ability; demonstrate the ability to use, recognize, and produce modal verbs of ability, request, permission, and advice.
- 4. Demonstrate competency in using singular and plural nouns, including correct spelling, and appropriate possessive forms, and with expressions of quantity for count and non- count nouns using corresponding articles.
- 5. Demonstrate competency with the use of subject and object pronouns, and possessive adjectives.

Demonstrate competency in using there is/ there are in affirmative, negative and interrogative sentences, and with articles a/ an, the / zero article.
Students Learning Outcome:

- * Describe locations on a map with regards to other locations and places using correct prepositions.
- * Apply knowledge of article usage to identify errors in a variety of sentences.
- * Compose a 5- 10 sentence paragraph showing correct forms of regular and irregular verb forms in the simple past and past progressive.

Classroom Expectation:

- 1) It's important to speak English in class to your classmates and the teacher'
- 2) Be prepared for each class session, by completing all homework assignments;
- 3) Have textbooks on hand at each class session (textbooks need to be purchased by the end of the first week);
