- Clear prior clinical requirements: Physical Exam, immunizations, Background check, drug screen, American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) Healthcare Provider Course,
- READ: IVC HEALTH ASSISTANT PROGRAM 'HANDBOOK'
- Student 'MUST' pass IVC Health Assistant course (Theory) with 70% = C or better
- Skills (PASS) is a 'MUST' during clinical (hospital) rotation able to apply theory into clinical practice/skills with patient safety, critical thinking of patients physical and emotional needs and report as problem issues arise to appropriate health care personnel.
- EVEN IF THE STUDENT PASSED THEORY AND NOT PASSING CLINICAL ROTATION STUDENT WILL NOT COMPLETE THE COURSE AND RECEIVE A LETTER GRADE OF 'F' FOR THE 'FINAL CLASS GRADE'
- Student has 3 times to retake the examination if 'failed' either written or skills portion State Exam
- Exam 'MUST' be taken within 2 years upon completion of approved course program
- Student is responsible to read IVC Web-Site for testing information and other Health Assistant Program information
- Student is responsible to read IVC student e-mails regularly for testing / instructor information
- Student is responsible to upload required information into 'Complio' account, IVC Health Assistant Program Handbook
- Student is responsible to bring immunizations to IVC SHC for initial review and upon completion
- Student 'must' receive a copy of completed 1. Physical Exam 2. Immunizations once completed to upload into 'Complio' account to 'Completion' prior to clinical rotation if NOT does not receive a copy of completed physical exam or immunization from IVC SHC nurse student will NOT be able to participate in the clinical rotation.
- 'ALL' Clinical Requirements NEED to be completed by the date given by instructor, NO EXCEPTIONS – IF NOT COMPLETED STUDENT WILL NOT PROCEED TO CLINICAL ROTATIONS. STUDENT WILL NOT COMPLETE THE COURSE AND RECEIVE A LETTER GRADE OF 'F' FOR 'FINAL CLASS GRADE'

Attendance

- A student who fails to attend the first meeting of a class or does not complete the first mandatory activity of an online class will be dropped by the instructor as of the first official meeting of that class. Should readmission be desired, the student's status will be the same as that of any other student who desires to add a class. It is the student's responsibility to drop or officially withdraw from the class. See General Catalog for details.
- Regular attendance in all classes is expected of all students. A student whose continuous, unexcused absences exceed the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet per week may be dropped. For online courses, students who fail to complete required activities for two consecutive weeks may be considered to have excessive absences and may be dropped.
- Students must complete 171 hours for Health Assistant Program course @ 15120 for completion credits And pass with letter grade of 'C' to be eligible to take the 'State Nursing Assistant Examination' for Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) State of California certification.

Classroom Etiquette

- <u>Electronic Devices:</u> Cell phones and electronic devices must be turned off and put away during class unless otherwise directed by the instructor. During Clinical Rotation NO Cell phone allowed.
- <u>Food and Drink</u> are prohibited in all classrooms. Water bottles with lids/caps are the only exception. Additional restrictions will apply in labs. Please comply as directed.

- Anyone caught cheating or will receive a zero (0) on the exam or assignment, and the instructor may report the incident to the Campus Disciplinary Officer, who may place related documentation in a file. Repeated acts of cheating may result in an F in the course and/or disciplinary action. Please refer to the General School Catalog for more information on academic dishonesty or other misconduct. - NO photo copy of exams or completed scantrons after an exam. Student will be asked to leave the class for the day and make arrangements to meet with Campus Disciplinary Officer for further action.

- STUDENT 'MUST' STAY TO GET RESULTS
- OTHERWISE STUDENT NEEDS TO WAIT UNTIL NOT DAY IN CLASS TO RECEIVE RESULTS OF EXAM
- DO NOT CALL, TEXT OR E-MAIL INSTRUCTOR FOR EXAM RESULTS
