Course Description

Expected learning outcomes

- 2. Students will improve on their typing and basic computer skills.
- 3. Students will be able to complete assignments for other courses and will be able to utilize adaptive software.
- 4. Students will be responsible for logging into the High Tech Center to record their hours in order to receive credit for course. It is expected that by the end of the semester, 100% of students will be logging into the lab independently.

Course Goals

Students will improve on their basic computer and typing skills. They will learn how to utilize software /hardware that will assist them with their disabilities.
