9. Correctly balance of the individual voice withing the choral ensemble so as to produce a choral sound appropriate to the style of the composition being performed.

In addition to ensemble performances, there will also be VOCAL SOLOS, and SMALL GROUP WORK, as befits our online format.

Indeed, Concerts will be done via ZOOM/JAMULUS, and will be of CHORAL Ensemble, as well as Solos/Small Group material.

**\*\*Indeed, our SUMMER CLASS, FULL-CHORAL ENSEMBLE will meet on Zoom/JAMULUS on MTW, and then, Thursdays will be for Solo/Individual Practice, and Small Group Projects (ON YOUR OWN).**
