Course Requirements and Instructional Methods

Classroom work:

Tests: There will be exams covering the topics reviewed online in the weekly modules. They will be taken in Canvas.

Assignments: There will be homework assignments from the required MindTap (Cengage) online site. These assignments will be outlines in Canvas. The assignment will cover the topics discussed in modules and on MNL.

Late work will be accepted with a 10% deduction per day, until Sunday at 1159pm. After Sunday late work will not be accepted.

- Regular attendance in all classes is expected of all students. A student whose continuous, unexcused absences
 exceed the number of hours the class is scheduled to meet per week may be dropped. For online courses,
 students who fail to complete required activities for two consecutive weeks may be considered to have
 excessive absences and may be dropped.
- Absences attributed to the representation of the college at officially approved events (conferences, contests, and field trips) will be counted as 'excused' absences

What does it mean to attend an online class?

Attendance is critical to student success and for IVC to use federal aid funds. Acceptable indications of attendance are:

- Student submission of an academic assignment
- Student submission of an exam
- Student participation in an instructor-led Zoom conference
- Documented student interaction with class postings, such as an interactive tutorial or computer-assisted instruction via modules
- A posting by the student showing the student's participation in an assignment created by the instructor
- A posting by the student in a discussion forum showing the student's participation in an online discussion about academic matters
- An email from the student or other documentation showing that the student has initiated contact with a faculty member to ask a question about an academic subject studied in the course.
