Course Description

This course provides an introduction to the basic concepts of music and the development of the skills and knowledge needed to read music, to hear music, and to use some instrument (including the voice) with skill. (CID MUS 110)(CSU)(UC credit limited. See a Counselor.)

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by being able to:

- 1. Perform the flutophone with pitches and rhythm from beginning to early intermediate skill of playing melodies on the flutophone in ensemble and individually (ILO2, ILO4)
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of musical notation, ledger lines(ILO2, ILO3 and ILO4) and also accidentals, diatonic and chromatic triads, sevenths chords, inverted chords.

Demonstrate knowledge of major scales (12 majors), minor scales (natural, harmonic and melodic), key signatures, and simple music transposition skills.(ILO1, ILO3, ILO4)

Course Objectives

The student will gain a fundamental knowledge of music, including:

- The staff, the treble and bass clefs.
- Note's value (up to sixteenth notes and rest notes).
- Accidentals, Scales (major and minor) and key signatures.
- Measures, meter, and time signatures.
- Dynamics, tempo, expression.
- Intervals (perfect, major, minor, diminished and augmented).



- Chords (major, minor, augmented, diminished, and dominant 7th chords).
- Transposition of simple melodies and accompaniment.
- Singing and performance of simple, fun songs.
- Performance of simple melodies on the flutophone (Individually and in Ensemble).
