Course Description

This course consists of individualized study of the appropriate techniques and repertoire for the piano at an advanced intermediate level. The focus is on advanced intermediate piano techniques, more compositional processes, ensemble playing and accompanying. Emphasis is on the progressive development of skills needed for solo performance. Achievement is evaluated through a juried performance. This course is intended for music majors as well as the general population. (C-ID: MUS 160, C-ID: MUS 172) (CSU/UC)

Course Prerequisite(s) and/or Corequisite(s)

Must have taken and passed MUS 142 with a grade of "C" or better, or demonstrate the skills required to test out of MUS142

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by being able to:

- 1. Perform beginning level-3 pieces with correct pitches, rhythms, fingerings, hand position, at a reasonable tempo, with expressions indications observed.
- 2. Perform all 12 major scales with the RH and the LH together. Up and Down 3 Octaves.



Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Be given a melody without chord symbols or bass part indicated, play the melody in the right hand with suitable triadic chords in the left hand after two initial tries with no more than three mistakes.
- Be given a melody with chord symbols or bass part indicated, harmonize the melody in the original key and then transpose the same melody to three keys. The student will allowed three provisional tries; no more than four mistakes will allowed on the final attempt.
- Play four-voice chord patterns of primary and secondary chords in all keys.
- Accurately sight-read music of an appropriate skill level at the keyboard. 2
- Accurately perform prepared solos of an appropriate skill level with proper articulation, dynamics, phrasing and expression, s appropriate to the literature being studied.
- Demonstrate a knowledge of the elements of music reading; pitch, duration (to sixteenth notes or rests), dynamics, tempo, and expression.
- Play prepared solo repertoire in a stylistically appropriate manner, suitable to the genre, period, and style of literature being studied.
- Memorize solo performance literature, when and as appropriate to the artistic tradition

Course Requirements and Instructional Methods

 This class is an asynchronous online class, and all classes are conducted on a canvas given to students. The method of the class is that every Monday morning, a new lecture is uploaded as a video of the instructor's lecture in the module section of the 16th canvas, and students must watch the video and participate every week and practice individually 45 minute daily.

The practical test must be submitted with upload by the student yourself with a video or audio recording of the quiz given in the quiz section of the canvas.

 - 2 times Scales Test and 3 times Demonstration individual performance. (Submit individually performance video) in the Quiz section of Canvas
