Course Description

Continues the development of all four language skills, emphasizing vocabulary building, increasing fluency and control of correct pronunciation, basic forms and structure. Students must plan for an hour of individual language laboratory by arrangement. (CSU/UC)

- 2. Create a discourse composed of simple sentences on a limited variety of subjects.

Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Student will demonstrate comprehension of basic grammatical structures studied in French 100 as well as new items such as past, future, conditional tenses, object pronouns and pronominal verbs.
- 2. Student will recognize and expand upon basic and survival vocabulary.
- 3. Student will combine knowledge of grammar and vocabulary in written and oral compositions based on specific topics given by instructor.
- 4. Student will perform his/her comprehension of grammar and vocabulary through question-answer sessions and role-playing.
- 5. Student will demonstrate aural comprehension through his/her ability to participate in meaningful communication in one-on-one situations with instructor.


- 6. Student will further discover aspects of French civilization and culture through selected readings.
- 7. Student will summarize readings both orally and written focusing on main elements.
- 8. Student will practice and repeat both orally the structures introduced in the classroom, in individual language laboratory sessions.
- 9. Student will expand listening and pronunciation skills in language laboratory with additional tape programs suggested by instructor.

Course Requirements and Instructional Methods

- This class will meet in person on Tuesday and Thursdays from 11:20-12:45. However, this is only half of the class instruction. The other half will consist of instruction on Canvas. There will be assignments and lectures that you will need to do online through Canvas prior to class to be able to participate in the class. These activities are in addition to online exercises which will count as part of the homework.

The online exercises will be due every week on Monday before class. Late assignments are accepted but will be reduced by 25%.

- There will be 3 tests. The first after chapter 4, the second after we have completed chapters 5 and 6, and the third after we have completed chapters 7 and 8. We will have a written final exam which will cover all material from chapters 4-8 in addition to an oral exam during the final week.
- At the end of each chapter, you will have a short writing in French to turn in. Please make sure to use the accent marks where appropriate.
- Finally, in each class, one student will be assigned a short 5-10 minute presentation on the music, art, dance, film etc, of a French speaking country that is not France. The dates will be set up on the first day of class. Material will be shared in the class Pronto.

Language Learning Outcomes for French 100

There is a distinction between Performance and Proficiency in a language.

Performance is a level of mastery as demonstrated in a controlled situation, such as a semi-scripted conversation or an exam. Proficiency is the ability to use language in a spontaneous interaction and non-rehearsed context, and in a manner acceptable and appropriate to native speakers of the language.

The following Students Learning Outcomes are based on the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL) Skill Level descriptions.

The student who completes this course with a B or better will be able to: Students will be able to

1-SPEAK at a performance level equal to Intermediate Low: Able to handle successfully uncomplicated speech in straightforward social situations. Express personal meaning by combining what they know with what they hear into short statements and discrete sentences. Are primarily reactive and struggle to answer direct questions or requests for information.



2-LISTEN at a performance level equal to Intermediate Low: Able to understand some information from sentence-length speech, one utterance at a time, in basic personal and social contexts, though comprehension is often uneven.

3 - READ at a performance level equal to Intermediate Mid: Able to understand short, non-complex texts that convey basic information and deal with personal and social topics to which the reader brings personal interest or knowledge, although some misunderstandings may occur.

4-WRITE at a performance level equal to Intermediate Low: Able to meet some limited practical writing needs. Able to create statements and formulate questions based on familiar material. Most sentences are recombinations of learned vocabulary and structures.]

5-Students will explore, analyze and evaluate the relationship between: 1) the practices and perspectives, and 2) the products and perspectives of the cultures studied. Given a set of cultural issues, students learn to identify, organize and analyze issues so as to express informed opinions, arrive at informed conclusions and propose solutions to problems.

6-Students will use language to reflect authentic cultural practices and perspectives in a limited way; begin to be aware of the value of the differences between U.S. culture and the language culture(s).
