Course Description

This course is an introduction to beginning keyboard skills, including notation. It includes basic technique, major and minor five finger patterns, major scales, sight reading and basic chord progressions, as they are encountered in beginning piano music. (CSU,UC)

Course Prerequisite(s) and/or Corequisite(s)

None. No prior knowledge of Music or experience playing piano is needed for taking this course

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by being able to:

- 1. Perform beginning level 1 pieces with correct pitches, rhythms (notes values), fingerings, hand position, at a reasonable tempo, with expressions indications observed. (ILO1, ILO2, ILO4)
- 2. Perform the five finger patterns for C major Scale separate hand with 2 Octaves (up and down)

Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Play the five finger patterns and triads for 6 major keys with both hand.
- 2. Play the basic chord progression in major keys with both hand



- 3. Demonstrate a knowledge of the elements of music reading: pitch, duration (notes values), dynamics, tempo, and expression.
- 4. Play the performing songs with several keys (choose with instructor)
