Course Description

A study of the theory, process, and practice of interviewing and counseling in community service and other counseling situations. The course is designed to assist the student to gain knowledge and develop skills to help a client or interviewee in counseling situations. Theories of counseling and basic helping skills will be presented, demonstrated, and practiced.

Course Objectives

- 1. Name therapies such as summarize, and explain the principal methods of techniques used in client centered, Gestalt, rational, emotive, family systems, ans psychoanalytic forms of counseling or psychotherapy, and will be able to compare and contrast each method or technique with the others.
- 2. Listen and empathize with a client for five minutes and then verbally reflect back (repeat using other words) the gist of what the clients has expressed.
- 3. Explain the personal and professional characteristics of an effective counselor.
- 4. Demonstrate advanced empathetic understanding.
- 5. Explain which of the methods of counseling he prefers and will be able to justify that choice.
- 6. Counsel a fellow-student (client) for one thirty-minute session.
