Course Objectives & Description

The purpose of this course is to study SHIELDED METAL ARC WELDING (SMAW). One of the prerequisite classes for the welding technology program. The student will acquire the fundamental skills necessary to practice shielded metal arc welding. Students will improve their knowledge of SMAW by learning about the safety standards in the industry, operating equipment utilized in Shielded Metal Arc Welding, and through class lectures.

Learning Outcomes

After successfully completing this course you will be able to:

- Arc welding presents dangers of electrical shock, fumes and gases, hot metal, arc rays, and fire. Students will learn how to apply appropriate safety precautions to prevent injury to themselves and preserve the equipment usually used during SMAW.
- Identify and recognize all equipment and tools used during Shielded metal arc welding (SMAW) and the ability to utilize SMAW in real life applications.
- Develop the foundation critical in maintaining proper and safe welding techniques in Shielded Metal Arc Welding on structural steel A- 36 plate.
