Course Description

ESL 003 is an integrated writing and grammar course designed for ESL students to develop language skills at the low intermediate level. Students will learn to write organized paragraphs on familiar topics. The course will also emphasize increasing vocabulary and grammar knowledge through reading and other activities. This course may be taken concurrently with other ESL Level 3 courses. Successful completion of this course will prepare students for ESL 004. (CEFR A2) (Nontransferable, nondegree applicable)

3. Produce a series of simple phrases and sentences linked with simple connectors like “and”, “but” and “because”;
4. Describe plans and arrangements, habits and routines, past activities and personal experiences;
5. Use simple descriptive language to make statements about and compare objects and possessions, and to express likes, dislikes and preferences;
6. Demonstrate knowledge and use of vocabulary to deal with concrete and everyday needs
