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Course Description: ESL 003 is a grammar class in an English only environment designed for the intermediate ESL student. The course will emphasize grammar and writing sentences and short paragraphs.

Course Objectives: Upon course completion, the student will:

- 1. Demonstrate mastery in classifying the following parts of speech: nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs of frequency, and prepositions.
- Demonstrate mastery in creating affirmative and negative statements, yes/no questions, and wh
 questions with the verb "be" and other verbs in the simple present, present progressive, simple
 past, past progressive, and the four future tenses; demonstrate the ability to use, recognize, and
 produce the present and past perfect tenses.
- Demonstrate mastery in using, recognizing, and producing modals of ability, request, permission, advice, suggestion, preference, necessity, prohibition, expectation, possibility, impossibility, and assumption.
- Demonstrate mastery using singular and plural nouns including correct spelling and appropriate
 possessive forms and with expressions of quantity for count and non-count nouns with
 corresponding articles.
- Demonstrate mastery in using, recognizing, and producing subject and object pronouns and
 possessive adjectives; demonstrate competency in using, recognizing, and producing reflexive
 and possessive pronouns and forms of "other".
- Demonstrate mastery in using, recognizing, and producing adjectives in correct word order as well as adverbs of frequency; demonstrate the competency to use, recognize, and produce comparative, superlative, and equative forms.
- 7. Demonstrate the ability to use, recognize, and produce adjective clauses using the relative pronouns who, whom, which, that, and whose.
- 8. Demonstrate competency in using, recognizing, and producing five verb + gerund combinations, five verb + infinitive combinations, and five verb + gerund or infinitive combinations.
- 9. Demonstrate ability to use, recognize, and produce two word (phrasal) verbs.

- 10. Demonstrate mastery in using, producing, and recognizing the coordinating conjunctions and, but, so, and or; demonstrate ability in using, recognizing, and producing dependent and independent clauses in both compound and complex sentences.
- 11. Demonstrate ability to use, recognize, and produce passive voice.
- 12. Demonstrate the ability to use, produce, and recognize level appropriate vocabulary of oral, aural, and written exercises.
- 13. Demonstrate the ability to write sentences and a six to ten sentence paragraph in one or more of the above mentioned verb tenses with correct capitalization, commas, and ending punctuation (period, question mark, and exclamation point.)

Grading
