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COURSE/CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

ESL 005 IS A GRAMMAR CLASS IN AN ENGLISH-ONLY ENVIRONMENT DESIGNED FOR THE ADVANCED ESL STUDENT. THE COURSE WILL EMPHASIZE GRAMMAR AND WRITING SENTENCES AND PARAGRAPHS IN A VARIETY OF RHETORICAL MODES.

 - o SUPPORTING SENTENCE
 - o CONCLUDING SENTENCE
 - o LEARN ABOUT BRAINSTORMING, CAPITALIZATION, COMMAS
2. SENTENCE STRUCTURE
 - o SIMPLE AND COMPLEX SENTENCES, FRAGMENTS, RUN-ONS AND COMMA SPLICES
3. COORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS SUCH AS: SO, BUT, OR AND

PREREQUISITES: "C" OR HIGHER IN ESL 004, OR APPROPRIATE PLACEMENT

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

OUTCOME 1: DEMONSTRATE COMPETENCY IN WRITING PARAGRAPHS WITH THE STANDARD ACADEMIC ORGANIZATIONAL PATTERN OF TOPIC SENTENCE, SUPPORTING SENTENCES AND CONCLUDING SENTENCES WITH THE THEME OF STATING REASONS AND GIVING EXAMPLES.

OUTCOME 2: DEMONSTRATE COMPETENCY IN IDENTIFYING AND WRITING SIMPLE, COMPOUND (WITH COORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS) AND COMPLEX (WITH ADVERB AND ADJECTIVE CLAUSES) SENTENCES CORRECTLY.

OUTCOME 3: DEMONSTRATE COMPETENCY IN CHOOSING LOGICAL CONNECTIVE DEVICES INCLUDING SUBORDINATING AND COORDINATING CONJUNCTIONS AND TRANSITIONS.
