Class Routine: The student will be at each class session on time, with the required texts, flutophone, a #2 pencil, and a notebook in which to keep notes, class handouts, assignments, and tests.

The course will cover approximately eight lessons (two units) every week. Every fourth lesson is a review lesson where the student can administer a self-test. The answers are in the back of the book so that the student can check his/her understanding of the material presented. Any material missed on the review lesson should be re-studied and the self-test re-taken. If the problem still persists, the student should mark the question and ask about it the next class session.

Quizzes: There will be TEN quizzes, one approximately every 8 lessons covering two units. Each quiz has 20-25 questions. The quiz with the lowest grade will be dropped and not included in the final grade average. Quizzes are worth <u>100 points each</u>. You are allowed *two quiz re-takes* (if requested) before final exam day. **Please note:** If you miss a quiz due to an unexcused absence, you will receive a grade of ZERO. No make-ups are allowed, unless the absence is excused by the instructor.

Performance Tests: In this class the student will also learn to play simple melodies on the flutophone. On the flutophone there will be <u>four</u> performance tests worth <u>100 points each</u>.

Final: The final exam will consist of a performance component (100 points) and a written (100 question Scantron) component (200 points) for a total of <u>300 points.</u>

Grade: The grade will be based on strict percentages. The student need only divide the total number of points received out of the total number of points possible to know his/her grade at any time.

(Make sure to include ALL tests in the tally, and delete the lowest written test.) 90-100%=A 80-89%=B 70-79%=C 60-69%=D 0-59%=F
