The IVC Concert Band

A. Course Description: Open to all students who wish to play music from the concert band repertoire.

A performance organization specializing in a wide range of literature for the wind band. The primary objective will be to provide the continuing music performing experiences needed by community adults, music educations, and advanced high school students. Maximum credit four units. (CSU,UC)

B. SLOs - 1) Students will attain better aural awareness and ensemble skills 2) The student will improve the understanding and reading of syncopated rhythms on his/her instrument.
3) The students will able to perform semi- difficult to difficult musical passages in a concert setting.

C. Required Materials:

- 1. "Essential Technique 2000 Book 3" Required Method Book for your instrument.
- 2. Performance Material will be supplied by the instructor.
- 3. Musicians must have their own instrument (Percussion & some instruments avail.)

C. Attendance Policy: <u>Regular class attendance is expected and recorded</u>. *Poor attendance will lower student's grade*. Up to six "outside-of-class" performances are typical for this ensemble and *all students* are required to paricipate unless excused by instructor in well in advance.

D. Policy on Homework & Quizzes: There are no written assignments however, instrumental performance and improvisation requires several hours of practice outside of class. 2 hours of independent work outside of class per each hour of lecture is strongly suggested for a good grade.
