Music 260/262 Intermediate Guitar Class I & II - Syllabus -

Course Description

1st Semester: A continuation of MUS 162 with the following additions: 1. Reading music (standard musical notation); 2. A thorough presentation of bar chords including sevenths, ninths, diminished, augmented, and various altered chords; 3. Advanced picking techniques.

2nd Semester: A continuation of 260 with the following additions: 1. Reading music (standard musical notation); 2. A thorough presentations of bar chords including sevenths, ninths, diminished, augmented, and various altered chords; 3. Advanced picking techniques.

SLOs: 1) Student will perform beginning level-2 pieces with correct pitches, rhythms, fingerings, hand position, at a reasonable tempo, with expressions indications observed. 2) Know and strum the 5 types of "Aform" Barr Chords: Major, Minor, Dom7, Minor7, Major7. 3) Know and perform one moveable minor scale pattern in any key.

B. Required Materials:

- 1. Notebook for keeping various handouts
- 2. A decent "playable" guitar (classical, acoustic or electric w/amp)
- 3. Music and learning materials will be supplied by the instructor
