Course Description:

Course Objective: Students will be able to

1. Classify vocabulary by part of speech.
2. Accurately spell 20 words a week through dictation.
3. Recognize, respond to and produce questions and answer in sentences with target vocabulary words both orally and in writing.

Students Learning Outcome (SLO's)

Outcome #1. Identify main ideas through picture/ graph/ chart/ title analysis and reading comprehension.

Outcome #2. Will be able to demonstrate the knowledge of spelling rules in English.
