Course Description:

ESL 005 is a grammar class in an English-only environment designed for the advanced ESL student. The course will emphasize grammar and writing sentences and paragraphs in a variety of rhetorical modes.

Objectives:

- 1. Students will demonstrate competency in recognizing prepositional phrases and understanding their punctuation.
- 2. Students will demonstrate mastery in recognizing and using noun, adjective and adverb clauses.
- 3. Students will demonstrate mastery in using, recognizing and producing dependent and independent clauses.
- 4. Students will demonstrate mastery in identifying the parts of speech: nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives, prepositions, conjunctions and interjections and sentence parts: subject, verb and complement.
- 5. Students will demonstrate competency in understanding advanced subject-verb agreement.
- 6. Students will demonstrate competency in understanding the relationships and functions of connecting devices including conjunctions and transitions.
- 7. Students will demonstrate mastery in using a variety of prewriting skills, brainstorming, clustering and outlining, which lead to the development of ideas and topics for paragraphs.
- 8. Students will demonstrate mastery in writing topic sentences with topics and controlling ideas.
- 9. Students will demonstrate competency in writing simple sentences with correct punctuation.
- 10. Students will demonstrate competency in writing well organized, coherent paragraphs with topic, supporting and concluding sentences of six to twelve sentences with the following organizational patterns: listing order, giving instructions and reason and example.
- 11. Students will demonstrate mastery in using correct capitalization in English.
- 12. Students will demonstrate competency in using correct punctuation and have the ability to recognize and correct run on sentences, comma splices and fragmented sentences.

Prerequisites: "C" or higher in ESL 004 or appropriate placement.

Student Learning Outcomes:

<u>Outcome 1</u>: Demonstrate competency in writing paragraphs with the standard academic organizational pattern of topic sentence, supporting sentences and concluding sentences with the theme of stating reasons and giving examples.

<u>Outcome 2</u>: Demonstrate competency in identifying and writing simple, compound (with coordinating conjunctions) and complex (with adverb and adjective clauses) sentences correctly.

<u>Outcome 3</u>: Demonstrate competency in choosing logical connective devices including subordinating and coordinating conjunctions and transitions.

<u>Outcome 4</u>: Demonstrate competency in writing a topic sentence with a topic and controlling idea.

<u>Outcome 5</u>: The student will be able to identify the subject and object in a simple sentence. <u>Outcome 6</u>: Demonstrate competency in applying prewriting skills to develop content for and organization of paragraphs.
