Imperial Valley College English 031 Verb Review 1 for ESL 031 Spring 2016

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Textbook: No textbook is required for this class.

Course Description: ESL 031 is a course designed to review and reinforce proper use of the verbs "to be" and "to have", and the simple present and present progressive verb forms. It is a recommended supplement for students in Beginning and Low Intermediate ESL course.

Course Objectives and Minimum Standard for a Grade of "C".

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate completion in understanding of the difference between the verbs "to be" and "to have" and to use them correctly in both oral and written form.
- 2. Demonstrate completion in the understanding of the difference between the simple present and present progressive form (oral and written).

Students Learning Outcome:

- 1. Select the correct verbs "to be" versus "to have" needed to complete a passage in English.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of and the ability to use the verb "to be" and "to have" in correct form.

Classroom Expectation:

- 1. Participate in class work groups.
- 2. Be prepared for each class session, by completing all homework assignments.
- 3. It's important to speak English in class to your classmates and the teacher.
- 4. Let us be respectful to the teacher and other students by turning off your cell

phones during the class period, the students appreciate your respect of allowing them to focus on the material at hand without disturbance.
