Course Description

Preparation for ENGL 110. The course seeks to facilitate the student's mastery of the short essay at the college level. The course follows in sequence from ENGL 008. (Nontransferable, nondegree applicable) (Nontransferable, AA/AS degree only)

Course Prerequisite(s) and/or Corequisite(s)

ENGL 008 with a grade of "C" or better or appropriate placement.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon course completion, the successful student will have acquired new skills, knowledge, and or attitudes as demonstrated by being able to:

- 1. Develop an essay that contains a thesis statement, provides adequate support, and employs an clear organizational structure. (ILO1, ILO2, ILO4)
- 2. Develop an essay that avoids sentence-level and grammatical errors. (ILO1, ILO2, ILO3, ILO4)
- 3. Develop a research paper that effectively synthesizes ideas and information from multiple sources and utilizes correct MLA formatting of citations. (ILO1, ILO2, ILO3, ILO4, ILO5)
- 4. Demonstrate an ability to comprehend and interpret college-level texts, including arguments, without relying on outside sources for assistance (ILO1, ILO2, ILO3, ILO4)

Course Objectives

Upon satisfactory completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Write multiple essays—including one mini-research paper and the common final—that, together, add up to 4,000 words of formal writing
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of the writing process, which may include pre-writing, drafting, revising, self- editing, peer group editing, and proofreading
- 3. Compose multi-paragraph essays that respond to essay prompts with clear or thesis statements or topic sentences
- 4. Compose multi-paragraph essays that use correctly formed sentences with few to no sentence-level or grammar errors
- 5. Compose multi-paragraph essays with clear organizational structure and adequate support
- 6. Compose multi-paragraph essays utilizing various rhetorical modes, such as comparison/contrast, definition, cause/effect, and argumentation
- 7. Demonstrate an ability to write for an academic audience and to adapt writing strategies for the requirements of the writing situation (particularly in-class writing)
- 8. Utilize research strategies, such as advanced search engines and electronic databases, to identify and evaluate resources for a mini research paper



- Synthesize information from multiple sources to produce a mini research paper that is formatted and documented according to MLA guidelines
- 10. Demonstrate an understanding of the rules regarding plagiarism and academic ethics
- Read actively, using metacognitive strategies to monitor comprehension, build vocabulary, and improve analysis of collegelevel texts
- 12. Analyze the rhetorical context when reading by identifying genre, medium, purpose, audience and tone
- 13. Analyze the organization and other strategies an author uses to make and support a claim, including the use of fallacies
- 14. Synthesize knowledge by relating texts to personal experience, to past and present events, and to other texts

Essay points: Total essay points include rough drafts (rough draft upload to Canvas, prewrites, outline, handwritten body drafts, 3 introduction drafts, 2 conclusion drafts) and final drafts (final draft upload to Canvas, 3 peer reviews, self-review, grammar review, and tutor review), and potential various other assignments relating to the essay. Students must take your essay to be reviewed by a tutor. Students who do not turn in the rough draft may regain up to 50% of the rough draft points by attending the instructor's office hours for at least 15 minutes to discuss their essay plans prior to the due date of the final draft.

Discussions: During the semester, you will read *The Distance Between Us: A Memoir* By Reyna Grande. For each week in which reading is assigned in these books, students will respond to a Reading discussion on Canvas. The response must include an engaging quote, one question for classmates, and relevant thoughts on the pages read. Students that do not participate in the class discussion on the pages assigned will not be allowed to submit their Reading Journal for that week.

Status Check: Status Check assignments allow you to review your productivity for the week as well as ask any questions, journal your thoughts, and generally express yourself.

Assignments: Assignments is a category for various assignments throughout the semester that still lend to the SLOs for the class but do not fit in other categories. This category includes quizzes, grammar assignments, reading comprehension assignments, and essay writing assignments.

Out of Class Assignments: The Department of Education policy states that one (1) credit hour is the amount of student work that reasonably approximates not less than one hour of class time and two (2) hours of out-of-class time per week over the span of a semester. WASC has adopted a similar requirement. This means that this 4 unit class requires 8 hours of work/week outside of class.
