Emphasis will be placed on late intermediate piano technique, all major and minor scales of 3 octaves hands together, all arpeggios of 3 octaves, hands together, chromatic scales of 2 octaves hands together, contrary motion major scales of 2 octaves hands together, late intermediate level sight reading skills, more expanded chord progressions including primary, secondary, 7th and 9th chords; late intermediate level harmonization and transposition skills; and performance of late intermediate level repertoire.
