Course Description

Prerequisites: The student must be able to speak and read English. Not open to students with native Spanish ability. (See SPAN 220/Formerly SPAN 20A). Concurrent enrollment in SPAN 113 (Formerly SPAN 5A) is recommended for additional oral practice. The beginning Spanish course is based on a contrastive analysis between Spanish and English and is designed to develop English-speaking students' rudimentary abilities in the four basic language skills: hearing, speaking, reading, and writing. The main emphasis is on the present tense of both regular and irregular verbs. The student will be familiarized with the features of Hispanic culture, which reflect the different frames of reference from which the native speakers of Spanish view the world. Students will have additional language structures, and vocabulary practice will be assigned. We will cover Chapters 1 through 6 of the textbook and Activities in Canvas/LibreTexts, as well as midterm and final exams.

Course Prerequisite(s) and/or Corequisite(s)

The student must be able to speak and read English. Not open to students with native ability in Spanish or those who have studied in a Spanish Speaking Country. (See SPAN 220) For additional oral practice concurrent enrollment in SPAN 113 is recommended.

- Completing all homework and projects by the due dates in LibreTexts and Canvas. You must manage your own pace doing the work on both platforms and not wait until the due date to complete all the tasks



because if you have an issue with the Internet or something else, you won't be able to finish the activities. Late work is not accepted.

Using the class web pages will be the equivalent of attending class. You will be expected to view the pages regularly (at least several times per week). You will be responsible for posting in the discussion area at least three times a week. You must post your activity by the due date, write a comment on two of your classmates' activities, and read the rubric for the discussion to receive full credit every week.

- <u>Important information for an online course:</u>
- This course is entirely online. It means everything will be online.
- You will take Quizzes, Escrituras, Prácticas Activities, Discussions, Midterm, and Final exams in Canvas. It is important that you complete all the assignments by the due dates.
- You will complete Práctica Activities in LibreTexts. It is important that you complete all the assignments on the due dates.
- Please review the orientation online, log in to Canvas, and click on Week 1.
- Watch the orientation video.
- Watch the video Repaso de la Semana to know all the assignments you must complete on Canvas and LibreTexts.
- Read the syllabus and take the quiz based on the content.
- This course is five units, so we have a lot of work to complete. Therefore, always pay attention to the week overview. You will find due dates for all the assignments, quizzes, and Práctica Activities in Canvas/LibreTexts. So, midterm and final exams are in Canvas.
- Students are responsible for knowing all due dates.
- Open just one browser when taking a quiz or midterm/final exam online. This is very important because if you open different browsers and accidentally close the one that has your quiz/exam, you will lose it. The system only allows you one attempt, and it is timed. I have no control over this issue. You will not be able to retake the quiz/exam. Also, do not refresh the quiz or midterm/final exam because you only have one attempt; this will count as your attempt.
- Use Google Chrome or Firefox browser. Do not use the Explorer browser.
- You must complete the discussion every week on your own time. Read and follow the instructions to complete your task. You must also comment on two of your classmates' posts every week to receive full credit for participation. Please ensure you read the topic for the discussion and the rubric that I will provide at the beginning of the week. There are two due dates for the Discussions; one is due on Thursdays before 11:59 p.m. and the second one on Sundays before 11:59 p.m.
- You will find the discussion topic at the bottom of the Modules or click on the tool Discussions.

Modules:

Go to <u>Repaso semanal</u> (weekly review) after watching the video and seeing what you need to do, go to <u>Capítulo</u>. In each Capítulo, you will have the modules for each chapter we will cover for the semester. You must complete all the activities assigned in each module every week, such as videos, practice activities, and practice quizzes because they take the place of the professor's lectures. Then, you will read and complete the tasks related to the modules and the Práctica in LibreTexts. The quizzes, discussions, escrituras, oral presentations, midterm, and final exams are in Canvas and are due at 11:59 p.m.



You must complete the activities in every Module (Canvas) and Prácticas Activities (practice quizzes in Canvas are not part of your overall grade.) because, in this way, you will reinforce your acquisition of the target language. These activities are not part of your overall grade, but you must complete them. You must complete all Prácticas Activities in Canvas/LibreTexts for every chapter we cover. In each module, we will review the previous week's grammar; these components are essential for a better understanding of the material presented in Spanish 100.

Be aware that the practice quizzes in the Modules in Canvas are not part of grade.

Quizzes & Tests:

There are quizzes in Canvas every week based on videos and grammar we cover in the course. For quizzes, please know that I realize that in life, many challenges occur, such as technical difficulties, illness, family emergencies, or internet connectivity problems. Considering these potential issues, I will drop the lowest score of the three quizzes, but be careful since I won't reset any quiz, midterm, or final exam. When you are taking a quiz or a midterm/final exam online, use just one browser. This is very important because if you open multiple browsers and accidentally close the one with your quiz, you will lose your progress. The system only allows you one attempt, and it is timed. Once you begin, you cannot retake the quiz or exam. Also, do not refresh the page because doing so will count as your completed attempt.

Written assignments:

You will be assigned several written (Escrituras) tasks throughout the course at the end of every chapter in Canvas. The instructor will assign the topics for these written tasks in Canvas. Paying attention to the grammar (including accent marks) is important. These tasks will be assigned at the end of each chapter. Be careful; these written activities will be graded based on their content, such as style, use of vocabulary, and grammar. Escrituras are in Canvas, and you must complete them. Otherwise, you will receive zero for those assignments. Read the rubric before you complete this task.

Discussions:

There is a discussion every week. The first discussion starts in the first week. You will find the discussion topic at the bottom of the Modules or click on the tool Forums. Click where it says <u>discussion</u>, and you won't see anything until you post your task. Read and follow the instructions to post your activity. There are two due dates for Discussions for each chapter. Do not forget that you will also have to comment on two of your classmates' activities. These discussions will be worth 12 points each. Your first post is due on a specific date, and it must have at least 100 words. Your second post comments on two classmates' activities and must have at least 50 words. Otherwise, you won't receive full credit. Also, you must type your first post to complete the second part of the discussion. In other words, if you do not type your first post, you will receive zero for the discussion on the specific week, even though you type the comments on two of your classmates' activities. If any student uses inappropriate language or disrespects another student, that student will lose points and need to have a personal conversation with the instructor. Remember, this is a college class, and the discussion should be academic in nature, so don't get off topic or you will also lose points. In addition, if you choose to upload a picture to your profile, ensure it is an appropriate photo and sized correctly, or I will have to ask you to remove it. For example, too much skin exposure, even on a baby, is inappropriate. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

Midterm and Final exams:

There are midterm and final exams here in Canvas, as well as practice exams before you take them. Also, there are practice exams. The practice midterm exam is going to be available from October 06 - 08, and the Midterm



exam will be available from October 09-12. The practice final exam will be available from November 30 to December 2, and the Final exam will be available from December 3-5 before 11:59 p.m. Be aware of the times and due dates for these tasks. If you miss them, you will receive a zero. There are no exemptions.

Oral Presentations:

You will prepare for two oral presentations in the target language. The presentation will be graded on content, preparation, creativity, vocabulary, fluency, pronunciation, and communication ability in the target language. You will be given more details about this during the semester. The first oral presentation is going to be from October 06-12 and the second one is going to be from November 17 -23.

Late assignments:

You must submit all your tasks on the due dates because late assignments won't be accepted.
